### 2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Tan / Brown flakes. No odour.

Most important hazards: This preparation is not classified as dangerous according to Directive 1999/45/EC.

Other hazards which do not result in classification:

Ingestion of large amounts may be harmful. If dusts are formed, inhalation may cause adverse lung effects. May cause irritation of respiratory tract. Inhalation of fumes, may result in metal fume fever, a flu-like illness. May react slowly with water, releasing flammable hydrogen gas.

### 3. COMPOSITION/INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

### 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

**Ingestion** : Do NOT induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice.

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- Inhalation** : If breathed in, move person into fresh air. When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice.
- Skin contact** : Remove/Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Wash off with warm water and soap. When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice.
- Eye contact** : Rinse with plenty of water. When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice.

### 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

**Suitable extinguishing media** : Dry chemical; Dry sand; Foam.

**Unsuitable extinguishing media**

- : Use water spray with caution. May react slowly with water, releasing flammable hydrogen gas.

**Unusual fire and explosion hazards**

- : Not flammable under normal conditions of use. May react slowly with water, releasing flammable hydrogen gas. Burning produces obnoxious and toxic fumes. In the event of fire the following can be released: Metal oxides .

**Protective equipment for fire-fighters**

- : Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and protective suit. Fight fire with normal precautions from a reasonable distance.

**Special fire-fighting procedures**

- : Move containers from fire area if safe to do so. Cool closed containers exposed to fire with water spray. Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses. Dike for water control.

### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**Personal precautions** : Wear suitable protective equipment. Refer to protective measures listed in sections 7 and 8. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak.

**Environmental precautions** : Discharge into the environment must be avoided.

**Methods for cleanup** : Remove all sources of ignition. Ventilate the area. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Clean up promptly by scoop or vacuum. Avoid dust formation. Use approved industrial vacuum cleaner for removal. Refer to Section 13 for disposal of contaminated material. Contact the proper local authorities.

### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

**Handling procedures** : Use personal protective equipment as required. Use only in well-ventilated areas. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Avoid contact with incompatible materials. Avoid and control operations which create dust. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use. Wash thoroughly after handling.

**Storage requirements** : Store in cool/well-ventilated place. Inspect periodically for damage or leaks. Keep out of the reach of children. Keep in a dry, cool place.

### Ventilation and engineering measures

- : Use only in well-ventilated areas. Apply technical measures to comply with the occupational exposure limits. Where reasonably practicable this should be achieved by the use of local exhaust ventilation and good general extraction. To avoid ignition of vapours by static electricity discharge, all metal parts of the equipment must be grounded. In case of insufficient ventilation wear suitable respiratory equipment.

### Respiratory protection

- : Respirator with a dust filter. The filter class for the respirator must be suitable for the maximum expected contaminant concentration (gas/vapour/aerosol/particulates) that may arise when handling the product. If this concentration is exceeded, self-contained breathing apparatus must be used.

### Skin protection

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### 10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

- Stability and reactivity** : Stable under normal conditions. Hazardous polymerisation does not occur. May react slowly with water, releasing flammable hydrogen gas.

If dusts are formed: Inhalation of dust may cause shortness of breath, tightness of the chest, a sore throat and cough.  
If product is heated: Inhalation of fumes, may result in metal fume fever, a flu-like illness. Symptoms of metal fume fever may include fever, fatigue, vomiting, muscle aches and shortness of breath.

*Skin* : None reasonably foreseeable.

*Eyes* : Inert particles may cause mechanical irritation of the eyes, including scratches.

*Ingestion* : May cause irritation of mouth, throat, and stomach. May cause nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea.  
Ingestion of large amounts may cause: Pain; Liver toxicity. Could cause cyanosis (bluish discoloration of the skin due to deficient oxygenation of the blood).

**Potential Chronic Health Effects**

: If dusts are formed: Pneumoconiosis, or "dusty lung" disease, may result from chronic exposure to any dust.
